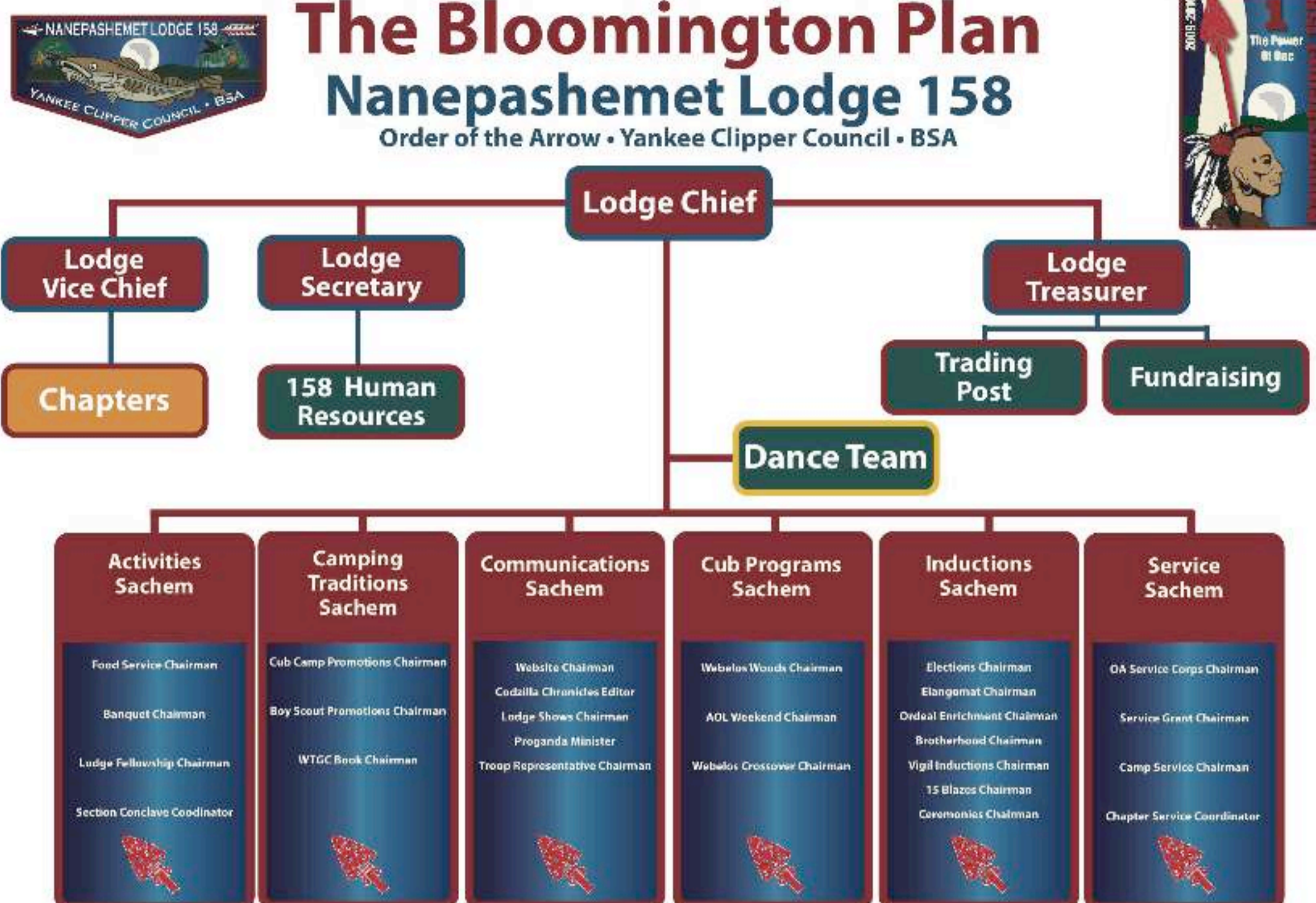


Our Lodge Is Growing!
