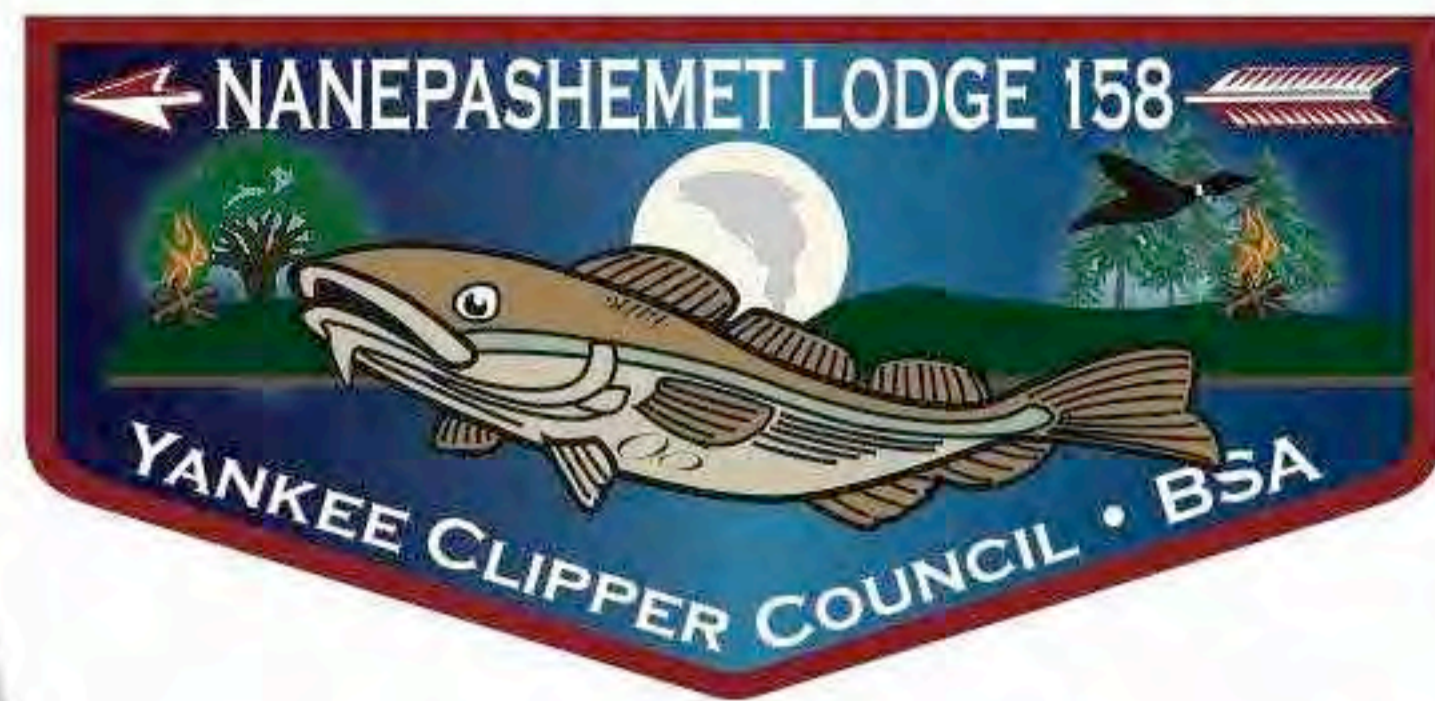

Moonlight On The Water Our New Lodge Flap



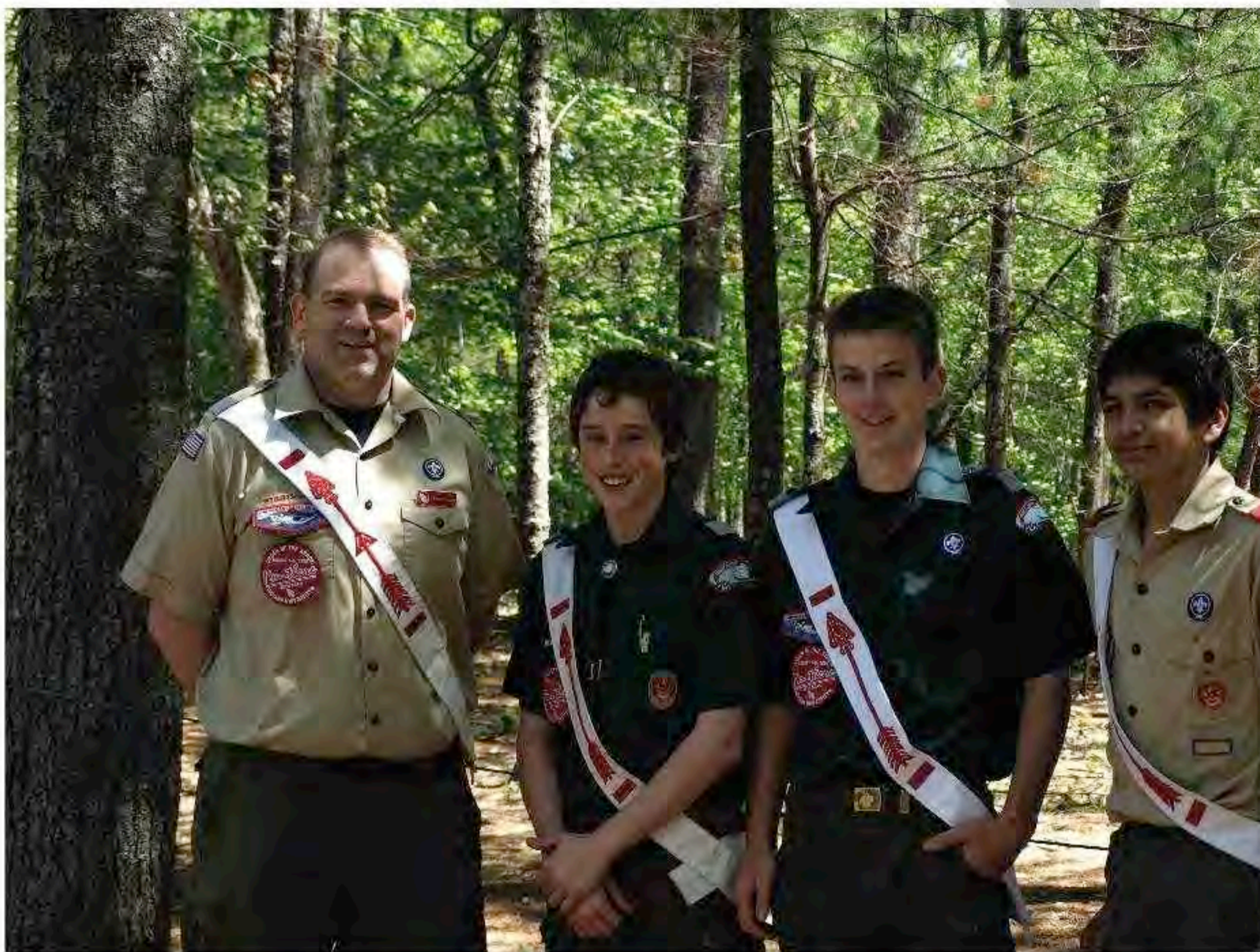
During the April Lodge Executive Meeting, the Lodge Leadership enthusiastically approved the design of a new lodge flap. The new design includes the famous Nanepashemet Cod, now joined with the aesthetically pleasing features that displays the spirit of Lodge 158. There are many symbols that are meaningful to 21st century Nanepashemet Lodge. Both Wah-Tut-Ca and Lone Tree Scout Reservation's totems are depicted. The camps are illuminated by fires and a shimmering moon representing Nanepashemet, which translates to "New Moon."

The flap was designed by Lodge Chief Paul Sullivan with some help from FStar Productions. Paul says, "I wanted something with lots of symbols that not only looked good but also told a story." The flap is full of little clues that appear to have been inspired by the movie "National Treasure". The name of this emblem is "moonlight on the water". The name comes from the words of Meteu in the pre-ordeal ceremony.

The scene is of the coastline where the Merrimack river empties into the Atlantic. On the edge of the bank stands the Lone Tree which guides sailors to port. Farther inland is the Northwoods where the cry of the loon is heard. Of course right in between the two fires of Nanepashemet is the unstoppable Codzilla.

There are many more signs of spirit that are embedded into the design. It is expected that scholars will debate what is there and what is not for many years to come. Hopefully no one will get too carried away. If you stand on your head and look in a mirror all you will see is an upside down lodge flap with the words backwards.

The flap is now on sale at Lodge events everywhere.
